

Some deposits in fields VF

Pharnakes II's son-in-law, Asander took the Bosporan throne after slaying the Roman nominee. He was confirmed as king by Marc Antony and, later, Augustus.

A PLEASING TRIO OF KYZIKENES DEPICTING HERAKLES




Kyzikos. Ca. 478-413 BC. Electrum Stater. 16.03 gm. Nude Herakles kneeling l., a club over his shoulder, holding a rhyton, tunny upwards behind / Quadripartite incuse square with high-relief borders. Von Fritze 15, 209. VERY RARE. A few edge splits



Kyzikos. Ca. 478-413 BC. Electrum Stater. 16.01 gm. Herakles (clean-shaven) crouching r. wrestling the Nemean lion, whose head he holds in a neck hold, tunny below / Quadripartite incuse square. Von Fritze 161, pl. V, 9; Boston MFA 1494. RARE

Herakles first labor was to slay the Nemean lion, an offspring of Typhon and Echidna.
