Here, the reverse type revives the memory of M. Aquillius Florus, who put an end to the second servile war and was the proconsul of Sicily in 101 BC. The type made its debut on a Republican Denarius of Mn Aquillius in 54 BC. This coin is a dual throwback to the Republic: Augustus reinstated the moneyer's name on coins, and in this case, the moneyer chose designs that honored his illustrious ancestor (this instance) or punned his name (a flower occurs on other of Florus' coins).
