



- 164 **Titus, as Caesar.** Denarius, ca. 72 AD. Tyre. Laureate and draped Eastern-style bust r. / Titus in a triumphal quadriga r., hldg a branch and a scepter, no inscription. BMC (*Vespasian*) 521, Hendin 789. *Two thin flan cracks at edge. File scrape marks on the reverse Titus figure and upper edge. Nice high-relief. Toned* **Almost EF** **400.**
- 165 Sestertius, 72 AD. Rome. Laureate head r. / Titus astride a horse galloping r., about to spear a fallen enemy who tries to deflect the thrust with a rectangular shield. RIC 613. *Deep olive sea-green over light pitting. Smoothing* **About VF** **250.**



- 166 **Domitian, 81-96 AD.** Quinarius. Laureate head r. / Victory seated l. hldg a wreath and a palm; VICTORY AVGVST. RIC 44. *Toned over pit and old scratch from edge in obv field* **Good VF** **300.**
- 167 Sestertius, 95-6 AD. Laureate head r. / Jupiter enthroned l. holding Victory. RIC 412c. *Dark forest-green over some roughness* **Good VF** **250.**



- 168 **Trajan, 98-117 AD.** Denarius, 114-7 AD. Laureate, draped bust r. / Virtus stdg r. hldg spear and parazonium. RIC 353. *Toned. Small scrape obverse margin* **EF** **80.**
- 169 Denarius, 114-7 AD. Laureate, draped bust r. / Radiant, draped bust of Sol r **About VF** **75.**
- 170 Quadrans. Laureate head r. / She-wolf walking l. RIC 694. *Emerald-green* **VF** **75.**

PLEASING AND VERY RARE TRAJAN PATER AUREUS



- 171 **Trajan Pater, father of Trajan and Marciana.** Posthumous, struck under his son Trajan. GOLD Aureus, 115 AD. 7.03 gm. Laureate, draped and cuirassed bust of Trajan r. / Bare-headed, draped bust of Trajan Pater r. DIVVS PATER TRAIANVS. RIC 763, BMC 506. **EXTREMELY RARE.** *Minor depression before Trajan's bust from strike (?). Toned* **VF or nearly so** **10,000.**

- 172 **Matidia, daughter of Marciana.** Denarius. Draped and diademed bust r. with elaborate coiffure / Matidia standing with smaller figures of Sabina and Matidia the younger. RIC (*Trajan*) 759. **RARE.** A few light pinscratches on bust. Nice high-relief. Toned. Choice **Good VF** 2,000.

- 173 **Hadrian, 117-138 AD.** Cistophoros. *Asia Province.* 11.08 gm. Draped bust r. / Within a beaded circle: Apollo standing $\frac{3}{4}$ r. holding his lyre and a plectrum; COS III. RIC 482, SNG-v.Aulock 6617 (*this coin!*). Attractive medium gray **Almost EF** 1,800.

- 174 Denarius, 118 AD. Laureate, draped heroic bust r. / Pietas stdg l. RIC 45. *Slightly granular. Decent portrait* **About EF** 125.
- 175 Denarius, 119-22 AD. Laureate head r. / Victory flying r. carrying trophy. *This type commemorates the British War.* RIC 101, BMC 212. *Pale-gray* **Choice VF** 275.
- 176 Denarius, 134-8 AD. Laureate head r. / Emperor stdg r. on prow (more like serpent) hldg spear and parazonium. RIC 294 **About VF** 75.

- 177 Sestertius, 119-21 AD. Laureate bust r. / Roma seated l. on a trophy, hldg Victory in her outstretched hand and a scepter. RIC 562a. *Some smoothing. Light blue-green* **Good VF** 400.
- 178 Sestertius, 132-4 AD. Bare head l. / Galley l. with four oarsmen, steersman, two standards and a statue of Minerva. Banti 372 (*same dies*), BMC--, RIC--. *Deep reddish-brown with green hues. VERY RARE variant* **VF** 1,750.

- 179 Sestertius, 134-8 AD. Laureate, draped bust r. / Hadrian on horseback r., three standard bearers standing l. before him. RIC 915var., BMCRE 1675. **VERY RARE**. Dark tan-brown over light roughness. **VF** 1,500.

- 180 As, 125-8 AD. Laureate, draped bust r. / Lyre. RIC 684. **RARE**. Forest-green over some roughness and reverse deposits **Fine / About VF** 150.

- 181 As, 125-8 AD. Laureate, draped bust r. / Roma seated l. hldg Victory and spear. RIC 685. Dark olive-brown over some roughness and some flashing on bust **Good VF** 150.

- 182 Sabina, Augusta, 128(?) - 136 AD. Dupondius or As. Diademed bust r. with elaborate coiffure / Ceres seated l. on a basket. Edge crack. Sea-green over some roughness. A few verdigris flecks **VF** 150.

- 183 Antoninus Pius, 138-161 AD. Denarius, 139 AD. Bare head r. / Clasped hands with caduceus and corn-ears. RIC 43. Light deposits and porosity at edges. Original lustre **Almost EF** 90.

- 184 Dupondius. Radiate head r. / Figure l. on a cippus within a temple. RIC 989. Minor tolling. **RARE**. Rich, glossy sea-green **EF and Choice** 1,500.

- 185** As, 155-6 AD. Radiate head r. / TR POT – XIX. – COS III – SC in wreath. RIC 958. *Deep olive-green, near black over minor roughness* **VF** **100.**
- 186** Divus Antoninus. Posthumous. Denarius. Bare head r. / Antoninus seated l. hldg branch and scepter; DIVO PIO. RIC 442. *Lightly toned* **EF** **150.**

- 187** Faustina, Sr. Sestertius. Veiled, draped bust r. / Faustina, cast as Ceres, seated on a decorated cart drawn l. by two elephants with riders. RIC 1140, BMCRE 1435, Cohen 202. *Emerald and forest-green. Pleasing types on an attractive flan, gently squared off. RARE and exceptional posthumous type* **VF** **2,000.**

- 188** Marcus Aurelius, as Caesar. Sestertius. 29.9 gm. Draped bare bust r. / Minerva standing l. holding Victory and spear and shield. RIC 1308. *Smoothing. Deep olive-green, near black. Good pensive portrait* **Choice VF** **500.**

- 189** Marcus Aurelius, 161-180 AD. Denarius, 170-1 AD. Laureate head r. / Within wreath: PRIMI DECENNALES/ COS. III. RIC 245 **About VF** **50.**
- 190** Dupondius, 172-3 AD. Radiate head r. / Jupiter enthroned l. holding Victory and scepter. RIC 1065. *Light sea-green. Sharp portrait* **About EF** **350.**
