A SPECIAL OFFERING OF SILVERED AE3s and REDUCED FOLLES

Initially following Diocletian's Reform, Folles were argentiferous and silver-plated (Antoniniani or Aurelianiani, also, for that matter), aptly called Billon. But they rapidly declined to being just silver-plated, while their size likewise was reduced, ushering in their metamorphosis into what numismatists call AE3s. The AE in AE3s applies well as these coins are normally found entirely Bronze. Reduced Follis are also normally found Bronze sometimes with hints of gray for the silvering has been lost through the ages. On the following offering, though, the silvering has remained, in many cases nearly fully intact.

A few coins of this group are illustrated in color as examples.
