This is actually an issue of a local North African ruler, but as it is anonymous it is classified under the Abbasids. Once an important mining town, Tudgha was some two days south of Sijilmasa. The positioning of the governor's name on this coin, while not officially an infringement of the sikka, is most unusual. Titulature etiquette had yet to be formalized at this time. However, placing a governor's name in the central area before the position for the caliphal heir was essentially not an acceptable practice, although there are some rare occurrences of it.
