Russian Cossacks riding down fleeing people / Goddess seated in clouds, resting on an anchor, pointing to All-seeing Eye of God, Arms below. **RARE**. Small area of acid corrosion, otherwise nice **EF** **150.**
- 572 Medal. Bronze. 1899. 40 mm. By Waclaw Szymanowskii. To Commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Death of Chopin. Bust of Chopin left / Lyre and olive branch. Uneven patina with black spots **EF** **75.**
