- 745 **Award Cross to Clergy for the 300th Anniversary of the House of Romanov.** Bronze. Multi-enamelled. 6.4 by 40 mm. Chep 1003. *Attractive enamel work* **About UNC** **300.**
- 746 **Award Medal to Commemorate the 300th Anniversary of the House of Romanov.** Bronze. 28 mm. Conjoined busts of Mikhail Romanov and Nicholas II / Five-line legend. Chep 1012, V 255. On a bar with ribbon **EF** **40.**
- 747 As above, but variety with Nicholas II wearing St. George Cross. Chep 1013. It is known that Nicholas II received the cross in 1915. So this is a noticeable and *scarce* variety. On a bar with ribbon. *Much of the original gilding is intact* **About UNC** **100.**
- 748 **Award Medal to Commemorate the 300th Anniversary of the House of Romanov.** Miniature. GOLD. 15 mm. Uniface. On original ribbon. **RARE** **About UNC** **300.**

**750 300 Years of the House of Romanov Silver Egg.** By P. Ovchinnikov. 1913. 5" long x 3 1/2" wide x 3 1/2" high (12.5cm x 9cm x 9cm). Total weight is 446 gm. Composed of two double-walled sections with gold-washed interior. The lid is applied with casting and an engraved 17th Century-style Imperial Russian Eagle surmounted by a crown. The rims are applied with individually-cast Russian letters and names Mikhail (for Michael Romanov) and Nicholai (for Nicholas II), interspersed with Arabic dates 1613 and 1913 and geometric bands. Both halves are stamped on the inside with the maker's mark in Cyrillic, as a warrant of the Imperial Court, an edge mark and '84' silver standard within an oval 'kokoshnik' mark.

The egg is basically in very sound condition apart from some shallow dents to the base section of the egg
