Philip II, 359-336 BC. GOLD Stater, 340-328 BC. Amphipolis. 8.59 gm. Laureate head of Apollo r./Charioteer driving biga r., holding kentron, trident r. below horses. Muller 145, SNG-Cop 525. Some surface nicks and light reverse graffiti. VF



Alexander the Great, 336-323 BC. GOLD Stater, 314/3 BC. Ake. 8.51 gm. Athena head r. wearing helmet with wide flowing tresses / Nike standing l. holding wreath and stylus, Aramaic date lower left. Cf. Price 3284. Scarce Small, shallow test mark at obverse edge 10:00. Nice high-relief and well-centered VF

MYSIA. Lampsakos. Ca. 460 BC. ELECTRUM Stater. 15.25 gm. Forepart of winged horse l., grapevine around / Quadripartite incuse square. Boston MFA 1582. A few edge splits. Good VF



Lampsacus. Ca. 470-450 BC. Electrum Stater. 15.30 gm. Forepart of winged horse l., vine wreath around / Quartered incuse square, the alternate compartments deeper. SNG von Post 171; SG 3881; Fr 294. RARE. VF

LESBOS. Mytilene. Ca. 377-326 BC. ELECTRUM Hekte. 2.56 gm. Veiled head of Demeter r./Tripod. Bodenstedt 91. VF

Phokaia.387-326 BC.ELECTRUM Hekte.2.53 gm. Head of nymph l., hair in sakkos /Quadripartite incuse punch. Bodenstedt 102.Well-centered VF

CYPRUS.Salamis.Nikokles,374-361 BC.GOLD 1/10 Stater.0.69 gm. Head of Aphrodite l.,wearing stephane /Head of Athena l. wearing crested and laureate Corinthian helmet. SNG-Cop 51.RARE .Small dirt deposit right obverse field . Choice EF

Kition. Pumiathon, 361-312 BC. GOLD Hemistater, Year 40 (323 BC). XX gm. Herakles adv. r. brandishing club and bow, lion's skin flung over his arm, ankh before / Lion attacking stag r., Phoenician legend above and date before. Babelon, Traite II, pl. cxxxi, 33; BMC 81. Rare. VF



KINGS OF EGYPT. Ptolemy II Philadelphos, 285-246 BC. GOLD Octodrachm. 27.43 gm. Struck after 265 BC. Conjoined busts of Ptolemy II and Arsinoe II r.; (A)ΔΕΛΦΩΝ/Conjoined busts of Ptolemy I and Berenike I; QEWN. Svor.603, SNG-Cop 132. Some evidence of jewelry usage, the Gallic shield behind the obverse busts has been smoothed off, and minor marks in fields VF+



KINGS OF EGYPT. Ptolemy II Philadelphos,285-246 BC.GOLD Tetradrachm, struck after 265 BC.13.86 gm. Conjoined busts of Ptolemy II, diademed and draped, and Arsinoe II, diademed and veiled, r., Gallic shield behind; ΑΕΦΝ / Conjoined busts of Ptolemy I, diademed and draped, and Berenike I, diademed and veiled; T EN. SNG-Cop 133, Svoronos 604. Nice VF with lustre

Kipunada, ca. 345-365 AD. GOLD Dinara. 7.7 gm. King stdg l with trident / Goddess Ardoksho seated facing. Gobl Kushan 596. Reverse die flaw. Almost EF

KUSHANO-SASSANIAN. `Varahran` (Kidara), after 350 AD. GOLD Dinara. XX gm. King stdg l. with trident, sacrificing at altar, trident-tamgha right field / Siva and bull. Cf.Gobl Kushan 727, Cribb 11. Reverse typically mushy from worn die. Good VF

KASHMIR. Karkota Dynasty. Shri Vinayaditya, late 5th century AD. Debased GOLD Dinara. 7.9 gm. Abstract Laxmi, ruler's name / Abstract king standing, Kidara's name. MACW-3656. Well-centered. EF

GUPTA EMPIRE. Chandragupta II, 380-414 AD. GOLD Dinara. XX gm. King standing l. w/ bow and arrow, compressed Chandra legend in right field like statuette / Laxmi seated facing. MACW-4803. VF
