



Anonymous. AR Sestertius, from 211 BC. Helmeted Roma head r., IIS behind / The Dioscuri riding r., ROMA between exergual lines. Craw.44/7. Scarce. Edge split. Deep gray over some roughness. Even F to About VF

L. Memmius. Denarius, **109-108 BC.** Laureate male head r., 6-rayed star before / The Dioscuri stdg facing with their horses. Craw.304/1. *The reverse somewhat off-center. Lightly toned* **Good VF**

L. Marcus Censorinus. Denarius, **82 BC.** Laureate Apollo head r. / The satyr Marsyas stdg l. with wine skin slung over his shoulder, column behind surmounted by a small draped figure. Craw.363/1d. *Light gray over faint obverse scratch. Rev. slightly off-center* **About EF**



C. Mamilius Limetanus. Denarius Serratus, **82 BC.** Draped bust of Mercury r., caduceus behind / Ulysses walking r., his dog Argus before. Craw.362/1, Syd.741. *Toned.* **Near EF**



L. Manlius Torquatus. Denarius, **82 BC.** 3.81 gm. Roma head r. / Sulla (head off flan) in walking quadriga r.; L.SVLLA IM in ex. Craw.367/5, Syd.757. Short flan. Toned About EF

C. Mamilius Limetanus. Denarius Serratus, **82 BC.** Draped bust of Mercury r., caduceus over shoulder, control letter A behind / Ulysses standing r., holding staff and extending hand to his faithful dog Argos. Craw. 362/1, Syd.741. Attractive toning. Slight weakness at edges Otherwise EF

L. Proclius. Denarius, **80 BC.** Laureate Jupiter head r. / Juno Sospita walking r., hurling spear and hldg shield, serpent before. Craw.379/1. *Nice old cabinet toning with light iridescent hues.* **EF**

M. Volteius M.f. Denarius, **78 BC.** Laureate Jupiter head r. / Temple of Jupiter Capitolinus, thunderbolt on pediment. Craw.385/1. *Top of Jupiter's head and right side of Temple flatly struck. Otherwise.* **EF**

P. Satrienus. Denarius, **77 BC.** Helmeted head of Mars r., LXVIII behind / She-wolf walking l., ROMA above. Craw.388/1b. *Light test scrape on helmet and weak test scratch on cheek.* **EF with lustre**

C. Hosidius C.f. Geta. Denarius, **68 BC.** Draped Diana bust r., bow and quiver at her shoulder / Calydonian boar r., spear thrust through it, being worried by a hound. Craw.407/2. *The reverse just a bit off-center. Lovely toning with iridescent russet reverse hues.* **Choice, EF**

C. Hosidius C.f. Geta. Denarius, **68 BC.** Another as above. *Medium-gray.* **Choice VF**



L. Scribonius Libo. Denarius, **62 BC.** Diademed head of Bonus Eventus r. / Garlanded well-head decorated with two lyres and a hammer. Craw.416/1a. *Toned with light iridescent hues.* **Choice EF**

Another as above. *Soft medium gray.* **VF**

L. Marcius Philippus. Denarius, **56 BC.** Diademed head of Ancus Marcius r., lituus behind / Equestrian statue on aqueduct. Craw.425/1. *Pleasing portrait. Bright* **Almost EF**

Q. Pomponius Musa. Denarius, **56 BC.** Laureate Apollo head r., crossed flutes behind / The Muse of Lyric Poetry, Euterpe standing r. leaning against a column and holding twin-pipes. Craw.410/5. *Well-centered. Light gray. Pleasing large Muse.* **Good VF**

P. Fonteius P.f. Capito. Denarius, **55 BC.** Helmeted and draped bust of Mars r., trophy over his shoulder / Warrior on horseback r. thrusting his spear at a Gaulish enemy, who is about to slay an unarmed third combatant. Craw.429/1. *Light amber hues. Slightly mushy striking upper obv. legend.* **Almost EF**

Q. Servilius Caepio Brutus (M. Junius Brutus). Denarius, **54 BC.** Libertas bust r., jewels in her hair / The consul L. Junius Brutus walking l. between two lictors and preceded by an accensus. Craw.433/1. *Pale champagne hues. A pleasing example.* **EF**

An issue of Julius Caesar's son-in-law and the most famous of his future assassins struck while he was a young moneyer.

ROMAN IMPERATORIAL

Pompey the Great. AE 24 of **Pompeiiopolis in Cilicia.** Issued under Domitian, *83-84 AD.* Bare Pompey head r. / Athena Nikephoros standing l. BMC 50. *Olive-brown with green hues over roughness.* **About VF**



Cn. Pompey, Jr., as Emperor. Denarius, 46-45 BC. 3.78 gm. Another as above. Gray. Even F



Sextus Pompey .Denarius,42-39 BC.Bare head of Pompey the Great r.,littus before,jug behind;legend mostly flatly struck and off flan /Neptune standing Craw.511/3a.Some flatness of strike at centers, some old scratches reverse center .Toned About VF to VF



Julius Caesar. Denarius, 48-47 BC. 4.09 gm. Laureate Pietas head r., LII (upside down T) behind / Trophy of Gallic Arms, ax on right surmounted by animal head. Craw.452/2. Old scratch in right obverse field toned over. Medium gray. Well-centered About EF or better

Julius Caesar. Denarius, **47-46 BC.** *Two banker's marks on Venus' chin, two small test punches on diadem. Toned VF*



Julius Caesar .Denarius,early 46 BC.Wreathed head of Ceres r.;DIC ITER (CO)S TERT/ Simpulum, aspergillum, jug and lituus,M in right field;AVGV R PONT MAX.Craw.467/1b.Well-centered.Lightly toned . About EF

Julius Caesar. *Posthumous.* Denarius, **42 BC.** Moneyer; L. Mussidius Longus. Laureate Caesar head r. / Cornucopiae on a globe, rudder at left, caduceus and apex at right. Craw.494/39. *Light test scratch upper obv. edge. Hornsilverying in rev. peripheries. Upper part of Caesar's head flatly struck, from brow downwards well-detailed. Toned. VF*



Denarius,early 46 BC.Wreathed Ceres head r.;DICT ITER COS TERT/ Simpulum,aspergillum,jug and lituus,D in right field;AVGV R PONT MAX.Craw.467/1a,Syd.1023.Nice full flan.Toned. Good VF



Brutus. Denarius, Fourree? **43-42 BC.** Laur. head of Apollo r.; COSTA LEG / Military trophy; BRVTVS IMP. Syd 1296; Craw 506/2. Some test scratches, and small core exposure on reverse, the core though seems to be of silver.Toned VF

Marc Antony. Denarius, **37 BC (?)**. Bare Antony head r. / Armenian tiara superimposed over crossed bow and arrow. Craw.539/1. *Banker's mark (7-ray star) on obverse. Toned Good Fine*



Lepidus and Octavian. Denarius, 42 BC. 3.89 gm. Bare head of Lepidus r. / Bare head of Octavian r. Craw.495/2, Syd.1323. Right margins flatly struck. Reverse slightly off-center Fine-About VF



Mark Antony and Octavian. Denarius, 40-39 BC. 3.62 gm. Antony bust r. / Octavian bust r. Craw. 528/3, Syd.1194. Upper area flatly struck, generally doesn't affect types. Deep medium-gray with vermillion hues. Somewhat crude. Nice Octavian depiction About VF

M. Antony with Octavian. AE 27 of Thessalonika, **ca. 37 BC**, Draped bust of Eleutheria r. / Nike advancing l. holding wreath and palm branch. RPC 1551. *Yellow-tan brown over roughness. Oblong horizontally. About VF*

Lucius Antonius. Denarius, **early 41 BC**. Bare head of M. Antony (Lucius's brother) r. / bare head of Lucius r.; L. ANTONIVS COS. Craw.517/5a. *Banker's mark CS on obverse, small banker's mark on reverse head. Toned VF*



Octavia, fourth wife of M. Antony. Cistophorus of Ephesus (?). Issued by M. Antony, **ca. 39 BC**. Within ivy-wreath: Wreathed head of Antony r., lituus below / Draped Octavia bust r. above cista between two erect snakes. RPC 2201. **Fine**

Cleopatra VII, Queen of Egypt, companion of Julius Caesar, fifth wife of M. Antony, 51-30 BC. Denarius, 32-1 BC. Bare M. Antony head r., small Armenian tiara behind; ANTONI ARMENIA DEVICT(A) / Diademed and draped bust of Cleopatra r., prow before; CLEOPATRAE (RE)GVM FILIORVM REGVM. Craw.543/1. *Thin flan crack from lower reverse edge, and from R in FILIORVM to top of head. Some roughness in the peripheries. Lightly toned. VF*



Cleopatra VII, Queen of Egypt, 51-30 BC. Denarius, 32-31 BC. Bare head of M. Antony r., Armenian tiara behind; ANTONI ARMENIA DEVICTA / Diademed and draped bust of Cleopatra r., prow before her; CLEOPA(TRAE REGINAE REGV)M FILIORVM REGVM. Craw.543/1. Small bankers' marks on neck of Antony and ear of Cleopatra. Pale gray. Fine

Augustus, 27 BC-14 AD. Denarius, 19 BC Bare head l./Mars standing within temple;(M)ART VLT.RIC 70b. Pale gray. Compact flan somewhat o/c on obverse losing left legend. Good portrait Near EF

Augustus, 27 BC-14 AD. Denarius, *15-13 BC. Lugdunum.* Bare head r. / Bull butting r.; IMP.X in ex. RIC 167. *Once polished. Near EF*

Claudius, 41-54 AD. Denarius, *ca. 50-1 AD. Lugdunum.* Laur. head r. / Pax-Nemesis advg r. pointing caduceus at snake. RIC 52. *Somewhat oblong flan. Lightly toned. VF*

Denarius, 50-1 AD. Laureate head r./SPQR P.P.OBCS in wreath. RIC 54, Cohen 93. Pleasing portrait. Lightly toned. Choice VF

Galba, 68-69 AD. Denarius. Rome. Laureate head r./Female standing l. holding rudder, sacrificing at altar; SALVS GEN HVMANI. RIC 232. Soft gray. Excellent portrait. Typical weak reverse EF /About EF



Otho, 69 AD. Denarius. 3.37 gm. Bare head r./ Securitas standing l. RIC 8. Lightly toned. Nice portrait VF



Denarius. 3.08 gm. Bare hd r./Jupiter enthroned r., RIC 21(R3). surface marks F

Vitellius, 69 AD. Denarius. Laur. bust r. / Concordia seated l. hldg patera and cornucopiae. RIC 72. *Attractive light steel-gray over light graffiti X in reverse field. Near EF*

Vespasian, 69-79 AD. Denarius, 69-71 AD. Rome. Judaea Capta. Laur. head r. / Jewess seated r. mourning before trophy; (I)VDAEA. RIC 15. *Good portrait. Old, light scratches rev. field. Minor deposits. About VF. 150.*

Sestertius, 71 AD. Rome. Laureate head r. / Victory standing r., foot on helmet, inscribing shield affixed to palm tree, Jewess seated r. before tree, mourning. RIC 467. *Rich sea-green. Tiny spot of verdigris on edge. Good VF. 650.*



Vespasian, with Titus and Domitian. Denarius, 69-71 AD. 2.87 gm. Laureate head of Vespasian r./Bare heads of Titus and Domitian facing each other. RIC II 2. Scarce. Short flan. Toned Good F

Denarius. 2.52 gm. Head of Commodus r. cast as Hercules in lion's skin / Bow, club and bowcase. RIC 253 About VF to VF

Domitian, 81-96 AD. Denarius. *Saecular Games, 88 AD.* Laureate head r. / Within wreath, a cippus inscribed: LVD SAEC FES, in field: COS-XIII. RIC 115. **Rare. Good VF**



Trajan, 98-117 AD. Denarius, 103-11 AD. Laureate head r./Trophy. RIC 147. Somewhat grainy, light deposits and some reverse tooling. Nice high-relief portrait. Almost EF



Antoninus Pius, 138-161 AD. Denarius, 140-3 AD. Laureate head r./She-wolf and twins r. in grotto. RIC 95. Deep gray over some obverse roughness and light deposits. Good VF

Antoninus Pius, 138-161 AD. Sestertius, 158-9 AD. Laur. head r. / Octastyle temple w/ Divus Augustus and Livia within; *TEMPLVM DIV AV CAESAR-COS IIII SC*. RIC 1003. *Deep olive-brown over old obv. scratches before head into neck. Flashing on head. About VF/VF*

Marcus Aurelius, 161-180 AD. Sestertius, 169-70 AD. Laur. head r./ Cuirassed Aurelius on horseback r., hldg spear, soldier before, two soldiers behind. RIC 978 (R2). *Light olive-green. Even Fine+. 150.*

Sestertius, 176-7 AD. Laur. head r. / Pile of Arms; *DE SARMATIS* in ex. *Light smoothing. Deep olive-green. Nice VF. 600.*



Commodus, 177-192. Denarius. 2.52 gm. Hd. of Commodus as Hercules/Bow, club, bowcase. RIC 253. Ab VF

Lucius Verus, 161-169 AD. GOLD Aureus, 168 AD. Laureate, draped bust r. / Aequitas seated l. hldg scales and cornucopiae. RIC (*Aurelius*) 593. *Excellent portrait. Near EF. 3,200.*

As. Laur. head r./ Aurelius and Verus standing clasping hands. RIC 1291. *Brown over some roughness. VF. 100.*



Pertinax, 193 AD. Denarius. 3.23 gm. Laureate head r. / Togate emperor standing l. sacrificing over altar. RIC 13a. *Deep gray over light roughness. A few small diebreaks at edges. Good portrait About EF*



Plautilla. 202-205 AD. Denarius 203 AD. 3.19 gm. Rv: Pitas stg r. RIC 367. Ab EF

Septimius Severus, 193-211 AD. Denarius. Laur. head r. / Legionary eagle between two standards; *LEG XIII...* RIC 14. *Near EF. 125.*



Julia Domna, wife of Sept. Severus, Augusta, 193-217 AD. Struck under her son, Caracalla, 211-217 AD. Antoninianus. Bust of crescent r./Luna driving biga l.; *LVNA LVCIFERA*. RIC 379a. *Minor weakness on reverse EF*



Diadumenian, as Caesar, 217-218 AD. Denarius. 3.36 gm. Bare bust r., draped and cuirassed/The Caesar standing, head r. with scepter and standard, two standards before. RIC 102. Rich medium gray. Handsome portrait on pleasing full flan About EF

Caracalla, 198-217 AD. Denarius, 201-6 AD. Laureate and draped boy's bust r. / Galley l. with rowers and passengers; ADVENTVS AVGVSTOR. RIC 121. **EF. 200.**

Denarius, 207 AD. Laureate head r. / Caracalla stdg, head r. hldg spear and parazonium, at his feet, a rivergod at left, and two captives at right. RIC 96. *Thin diecrack at lower edge. Lightly toned.* **EF. 250.**

Severus Alexander, 222-235 AD. As, 229 AD. Laureate bust r., drapery at shoulder / The emperor, hldg an eagle-tipped scepter, in quadriga r. RIC 498. *Semi-glossy sea-green with deep burgundy hues over roughness in peripheries. Smoothing. A Scarce and popular type.* **VF, near Choice. 275.**

Herennia Etruscilla, Augusta, 249-253 (?) AD. Sestertius. Diad. and draped bust r. / Fecunditas stdg. l. hldg cornucopiae and wreath, small child before her. RIC 135. *Forest-green over minor pitting. Pleasing portrait.* **Choice VF. 250.**

Volusian, 251-253 AD. Sestertius, 251 AD. Rome. Laureate, draped and cuirassed bust r. / Juno, a peacock at her side, seated within a tetrastyle temple with a dome roof; IVNONI MARTIALI SC. RIC 252a. *Well-struck on a full, square planchet. Deep sea-green well smoothed.* **Near EF. 250.**

Sestertius. Similar to above, but Juno seated within a distyle temple. RIC 253 (**Rare**). *Olive brown-green over some roughness.* **VF. 200.**

Mariniana, wife of Valerian I. Posthumous. Antoninianus. Veiled, draped bust r. on crescent / Peacock r. flying Mariniana heavenward. Cohen 16. *Somewhat grainy. Toned.* **VF+. 100.**



Maximianus II, as Augustus, 310-313 AD. Billon Argenteus. Trier. Radiate, draped and cuirassed half-bust l. raising hand with scepter and holding globe / Sol in facing quadriga, two horses at either side each facing in opposite directions. RIC 826 (R3). Pale purple-gray. Typical soft mushy strike. Almost EF 400.

Julian II, 360-363 AD. Reduced Siliqua, 361-3 AD. Sirmium. Diad., draped and cuir. bust r. / VOTIS V MVLTIS X in wreath; SIRM in ex. RIC 102. *Thin obv. diecrack at 12:30 to eye. Toned.* **EF. 150.**
